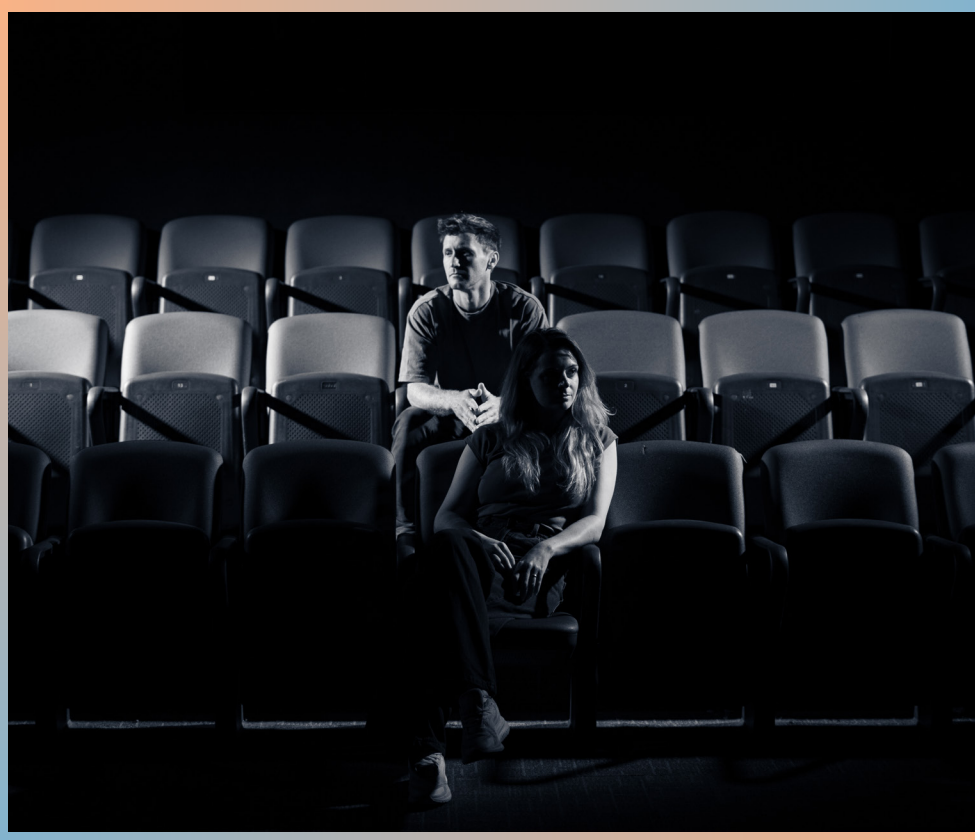

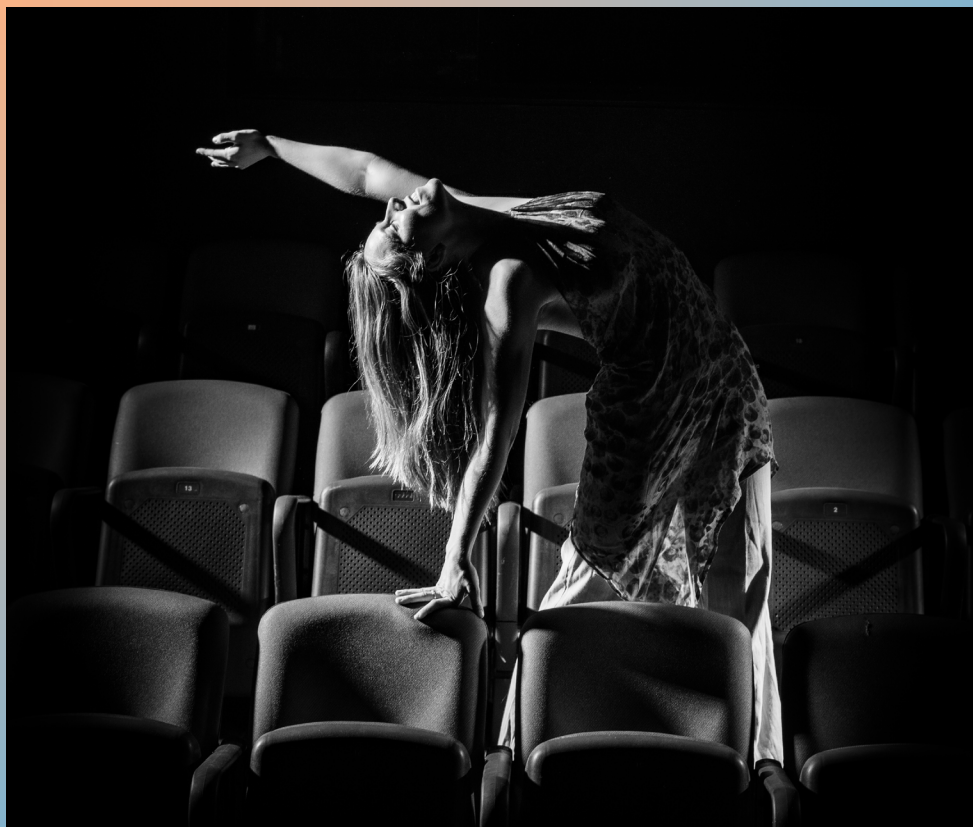

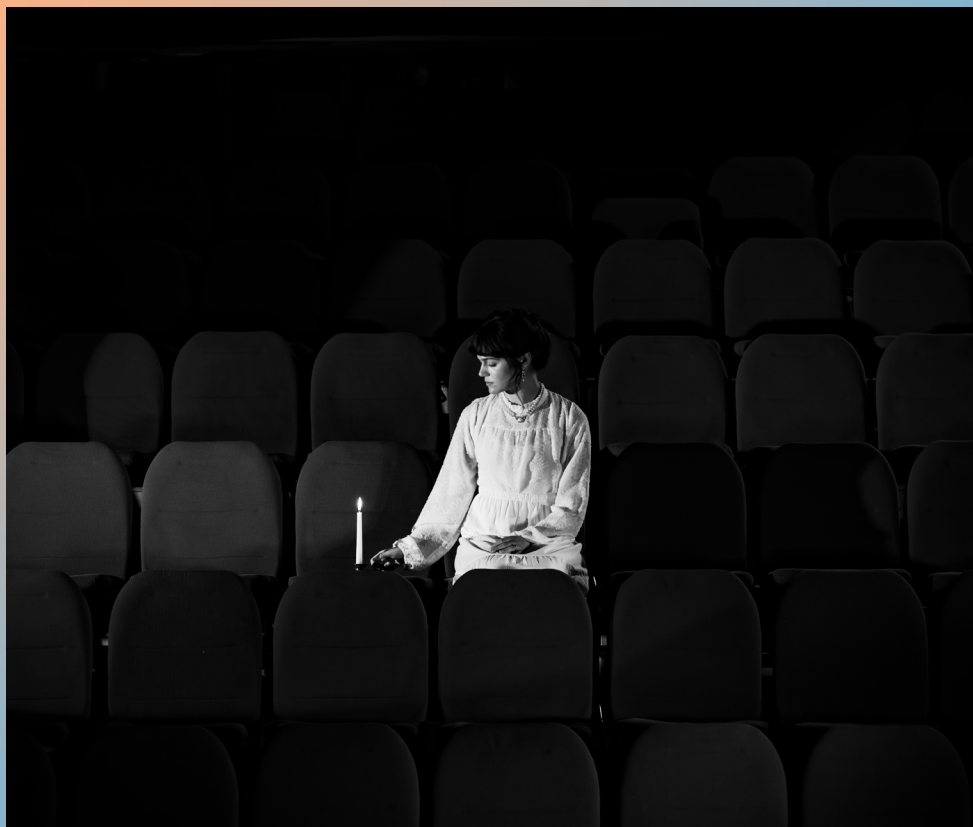
How The KKK Saved The Day

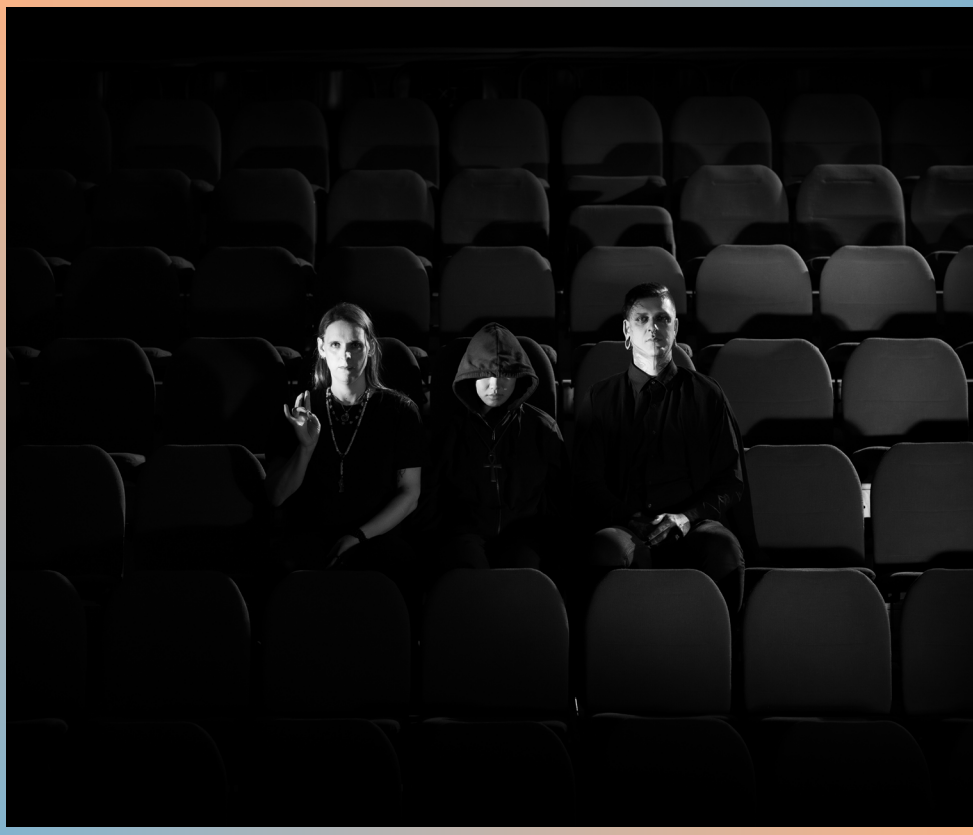
Written by a Robot

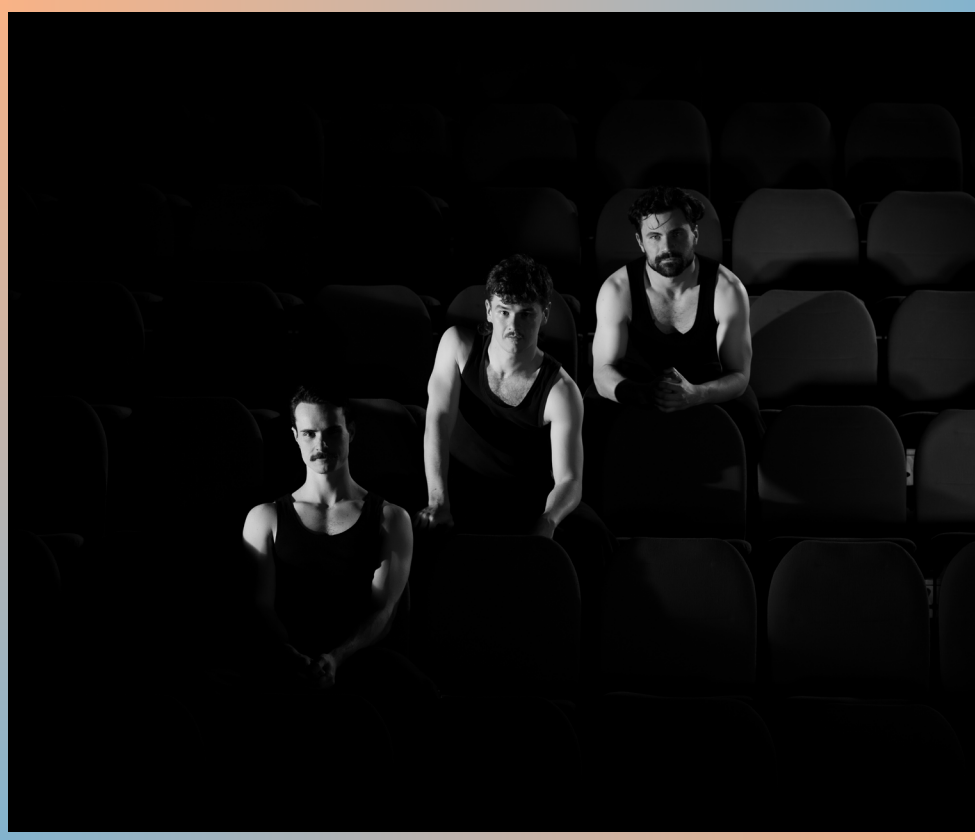

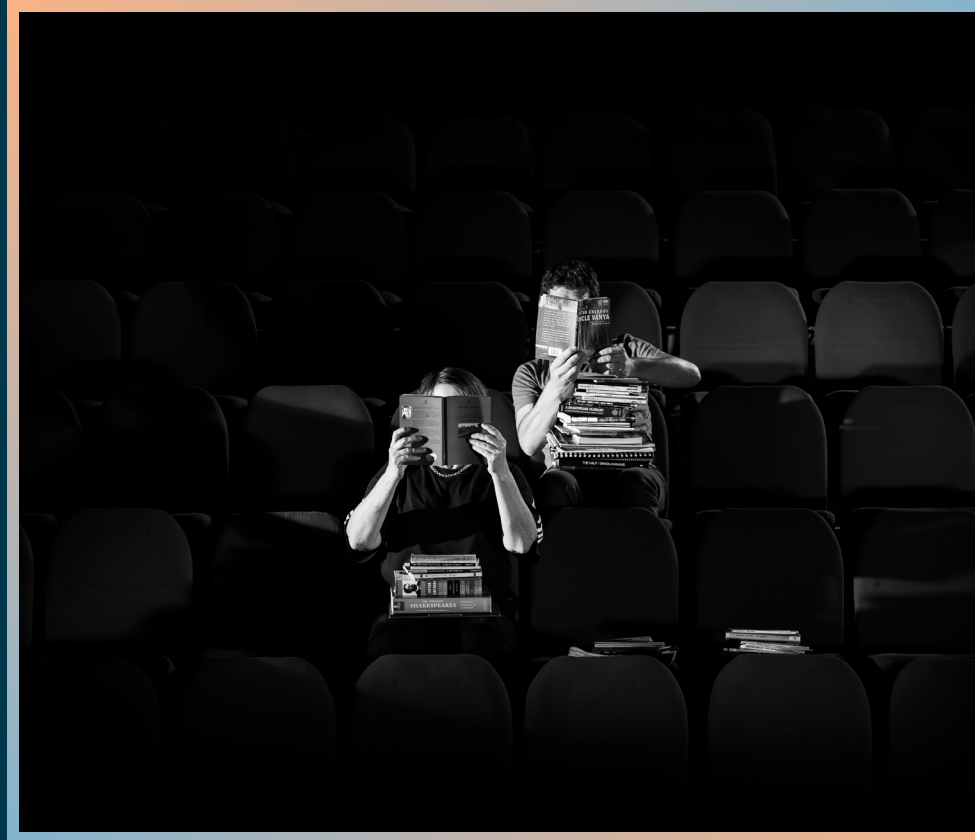
Join the journey: vacant spaces, hidden stories.
