I have always been passionate about theatre which doesn't provide us all the answers, or tell us what to think, rather, theatre that hopes to be the start of an important conversation.

And for me, this play is all about a conversation. At its core, the topics it explores are difficult, confronting and deeply important. It is a story about love, relationships and that line between care and control. I wanted to create something that speaks honestly to the complexity that can exist in relationships, while also making space for resilience and humanity.

This play is not just about one couple. It is about all of us and how we, as a society, navigate the balance between love and power.

Staging my first play in Australia has been daunting. However I've been incredibly lucky to work with a remarkable team on this production. Their generosity, insight and sensitivity have helped shape this work into something I hope we are all proud of. I couldn't be more thankful to them. Shadow of Doubt is for anyone who has experienced control or fear where there should have been safety. It's for those navigating that space, and it's for those who are trying to understand.


